

FEPA AWARDS 2015

CHARACTERISTICS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR NOMINATIONS

FEPA MEDAL FOR EXCEPTIONAL SERVICE TO ORGANIZED PHILATELY

It is awarded to a philatelist or an organization that has provided exceptional service to the European organized philately.

The proposal, signed by the President of the Federation, must highlight the candidate's service to European philately. Hence nominations based on just national achievements are inappropriate.

The proposal – to be sent to Giancarlo Morolli¹ – must be accompanied by

1. A very short philatelic curriculum vitae of the candidate
2. A colour photo (300 dpi, jpg format)
3. A letter with the consent of the candidate, with signature.

FEPA MEDAL FOR EXCEPTIONAL PHILATELIC STUDY AND RESEARCH

It is construed as a literary prize to be awarded to the author(s) of study and research in printed form or otherwise to the furtherance of philately (not necessarily the European one only).

A member Federation can submit more than one proposal.

Works must have been published from 1.1.2014 to 31.12.2015.

Proposals shall concern research of a European status rather than the best work of a country, which might be very good but not of continental relevance.

Each proposal, signed by the President of the Federation, must highlight the relevance of the study and research in addition to a short abstract of the work...

The proposal – to be sent to Giancarlo Morolli¹ – must be accompanied by

1. A very short abstract of the work
2. A colour image of the cover (300 dpi, jpg format)
3. A colour photo of the author(s) (300 dpi, jpg format)
4. A letter with the consent of the candidate, with signature.

Furthermore one copy of the book must be sent to the FEPA President, José-Ramón Moreno, Tabladilla, 2 - P7 -3° C, 41013 Seville, Spain.

As the book is the basis for starting the evaluation process, in case it does not reach the President by 31.01.2016 the relevant proposal cannot be taken into consideration.

FEPA MEDAL FOR SERVICE OR SUPPORT TO PHILATELY

It is awarded to an individual, outside of the philatelic family, who has given a significant service or support to European Philately.

The proposal, signed by the President of the Federation, must highlight the candidate's service to European philately. Hence nominations based on just national achievements are inappropriate.

The proposal – to be sent to Giancarlo Morolli¹ – must be accompanied by a very short profile of the candidate.

Being the recipient outside of the philatelic organizations, his/her colour photo (300 dpi, jpg format) and consent will be asked after the selection by the Board.

CERTIFICATE OF APPRECIATION FOR OUTSTANDING ACTIVITIES FOR THE PROMOTION OF PHILATELY

It is awarded to Societies (max 5) which have given a significant service or support to European Philately on regional or local level.

The proposal, signed by the President of the Federation, must highlight the Society's service to European philately.

Hence nominations based only on national achievements or for marking important anniversaries are inappropriate.

The proposal – sent to Giancarlo Morolli¹ – must be accompanied by

1. A short profile of the Society **according to the following outline**

- Full name of the Society, Association, Union or Club; Address,
- Date of foundation; Present number of Members
- Reason for proposal
- History (only key facts)
- Magazine/Bulletin and other Publications
- Major Exhibitions organized
- Other Achievements
- Distinctions or awards received by the Society
- Impact of the Society in the local society
- Any other aspect supporting the main reasons for nomination.

2. Its logo in colour (300 dpi, jpg format)

3. A letter with the consent of the President of the Society, with signature.
