aims to be a NOTEBLE CULTURAL EVENT







"PHILOTELIA" receives a M/S as a Birthday Gift

The bimonthly journal of the Hellenic Philatelic Society has celebrated its 100th Anniversary of uninterrupted publication and the Hellenic Post marked this Anniversary by issuing a Miniature Sheet for «PHILOTELIA» Journal.

This artwork has achieved to integrate the most important moments of the Journal such as International Philatelic Awards, the Commendation of the Athens Academy, iconic stamps and cancellations as well as the two indispensable "tools" of philatelic study and article writing: a magnifying lens and a fountain pen having its upper dotted referring to the Journal's contemporary digital status.

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


Inside the space of the stamp's perforation, the world-famous Large Hermes Head is shown due to its international fame so the identity of the product overcomes the barrier of language.

Since the whole background composition is related to the historical path of PHILOTELIA, it is proposed that the contemporary trend of publishing be captured in a logo. Therefore, the concept of research and writing (fountain pen and magnifying lens) is condensed with new digital media (pixel on the top of the pen) with the notion of uninterrupted circulation (using the infinity symbol in place of the two zeros). The new trends of the magazine are proposed to be symbolically reflected by a modern printing method, i.e. blue foil.

The M/S was jointly presented by the Hellenic Post (EL.TA) and the Hellenic Philatelic Society (H.P.S) on February 21st 2024 at the War Museum. The speakers of this event referred both to the artistic aspect and the significant contribution of PHILOTELIA Journal for 100 uninterrupted years to the Greek philatelic community.

Call for a BALKANFILA Study Group




Dear Balkan Philatelists,

My name is Firat Akan, and I have received an education in International Relations. I am particularly interested in the research aspect of philately and its intersection with politics. One of the topics I have been working on is the Balkan Postal Union. I have examined the Balkan Postal Union within the archives of the Republic of Turkey. Not only do I have a displayed collection on this subject, but I also have published the article "Balkan Union Postal Rates of Turkey" in the Turkish Philatelic Academy Annual 2021 and XIX Balkanfila Exhibition Catalog covering the inter-state postal arrangements between Turkey, Greece, Romania, Yugoslavia and Czechoslovakia, specifically special (reduced) Balkan postal rates in the period from 1931 to 1940. The information available in Turkish archives should also be present in archives of other Balkan countries. If there are individuals interested in collaborating on this topic, whether as philatelists or historians, let us expand our efforts together. If we can establish a working group, we can share our findings. An experienced philatelist could lead the group.



Ankara Philatelic Society continues its educational and informative seminars, which it started online during the coronavirus pandemic, physically in the Society's facility. The events, in which an Association member's exhibition that has won awards in competitions is presented every month, attract great attention from collectors in Ankara.





"Yehudi Menuhin Prize" for the Best Music Stamps

The international philatelic music study group "Motivgruppe Musik", founded in 1959, organizes every year a contest for the Best Music Stamp of the previous year.

For the Best Music Stamp Contest in 2023, participated 69 stamps issued in 2022 by 55 Postal Services worldwide.

The public voting awarded the 1st place for the "Yehudi Menuhin Prize" to Austria with a stamp depicting a Trombone on a Score, while Uruguay took the 2nd place with a stamp for ballerina Maria Noel Ricceto.



The Greek entry that won the 3rd place was designed by artist Dr. Myrsini Vardopoulou was a single stamp – from the four-stamp issue of "First Urban Refugee Settlements" – depicting the imposing figure of a refugee playing his string instrument at the foreground.



The famous violinist and conductor Sir Yehudi Menuhin was Patron of the Philatelic Music Circle for 30 years from 1969 until his death in 1999. After his death, the PMC members decided to award the price for the most popular music stamp in memory of Sir Yehudi Menuhin. The award is named after Lord Menuhin with the full agreement of his family.

Yehudi Menuhin was born in New York in 1916. Aged only nine he gave his first solo concert. As a famous violinist and conductor he traveled around the whole world. Besides of his career he always promoted young and talented musicians. Yehudi Menuhin died in Berlin in 1999.



For Motivgruppe Musik it is a great honor to continue the tradition of presenting the award in memory of Lord Yehudi Menuhin. The Yehudi-Menuhin-Trophy is annually awarded to the designer of the most popular music stamp issued in the previous year. The winners are chosen by all stamp collectors interested in music philately.

A Souvenir Sheet dedicated to the 130th Anniversary of Organized Philately in Bulgaria



On December 2nd, 2023, during the "Christmas Plovdiv" philatelic exhibition, a souvenir sheet with one postage stamp dedicated to the 130th anniversary of the organized philatelic movement in Bulgaria came into use. The wonderful graphic solution of the authors - the artists Tahsin Ahmed and Todor Angeliyev - present on the publication the images of some of the most prominent figures of the movement in the style of cartoon drawing. Some of the heroes of the block are also people who, in addition to having connected their lives with public philatelic activity, are also an inseparable segment of Bulgarian culture and art, such as the writer Elin Pelin, the master of circus art Lazar Dobrich and the remarkable artist Stefan Kanchev. It should be noted that of the philatelic figures shown, only two were awarded this honor during their lifetime - the honorary chairman of the Union of Bulgarian Philatelists His Majesty Tsar Simeon II, as well as probably the oldest active philatelist and philatelic author not only in Bulgaria, but also in the Balkans - Andrey Penchev, who on March 30th, 2024 celebrates his 100th anniversary. On the souvenir sheet you can see many more deserving philatelists, part of the history of Bulgarian philately such as Atanas Kirilov - the publisher of the first Bulgarian philatelic magazine "Timbrofil", the world-famous philatelic expert Petko Karaivanov, the long-time chairman of the Union of Bulgarian Philatelists Ivan Slavkov... Also depicted are some of the rarest Bulgarian stamps such as the "Inverted Cavalry", issues from the early Bulgarian classics...

The souvenir sheet "130 years of organized philatelic movement in Bulgaria" has a circulation of 1,800 sets, which include a perforated and non-perforated copy.


PATRIACH of BULGARIAN and BALKAN PHILATELY

On March 30, the distinguished Bulgarian philatelist, exhibitor and philatelic researcher Andrey Penchev turns 100 years old! There are few who have reached this patriarchal age in strength and reason, and Andrei is one of them. He was born in 1924 in Gabrovo. There, as a primary school student, he first touched the beauty of the postage stamp. And the fascination with this magic remained with him throughout his life.

He is one of the most prominent Bulgarian exhibitors in the 1980s. His exhibits receive high awards at the most authoritative philatelic forums, the pinnacle being gold medals from FINLAND 88 and BULGARIA 89 in the Postal History class.

For almost six decades, Andrey Penchev wrote and published his remarkable studies in the philatelic press. His approach to certain historical facts and events may seem to some too free and self-willed, but it is certain that time – the best judge, long ago set a high mark on all that he wrote!

Cheers to the centenarian of Bulgarian philately! To live!



The Beginning of the Organized Philately in Bulgaria: 1893 – 1939

March 31st, 1893. On this date one hundred and thirty years ago, a few enthusiasts founded the first philatelic society in Bulgaria in Plovdiv. The beginning is set.

On October 15th, 1893, the society, which already had 50 members, published its printed organ "Voice of the Bulgarian Timbrophilic Society". This is the second philatelic magazine in Bulgaria after the monthly "Timbrofil", published in 1891 in Panagyurishte by the enlightened and patriotic Bulgarian Atanas Kirilov.

Again in Plovdiv in those years, Hristo G. Danov published the first Bulgarian "Album for stamps from around the world".

In 1893, at the world exhibition in Chicago, the Bulgarian merchant Samuel Blaustein displayed Bulgarian and foreign stamps at his boot, we learn this from Aleko Konstantinov's travelogue "To Chicago and Back".



Until 1921, no other philatelic societies were established, but in different cities of the country there were groups of collectors who corresponded with each other and exchanged postage stamps. On the other hand, a number of philatelic publications appeared: in 1909, the magazine "International Review" with publisher and editor Vasil Apostolov from Sofia; 1911 "La Bulgarie" magazine, edited by Simo P. Simov from Pleven, 1920 – "Complete guide to the collection, evaluation and preservation of postage stamps and catalog of Bulgarian postage stamps up to 1921."

After the First World War, interest in philately grew. In 1921, the philatelic society in Plovdiv was restored, and until 1927, 38 philatelic editions were published in different cities and with different durations: in Sofia 14, in Pleven 4, in Burgas, Plovdiv, Svishtov and Targovishte 3 each, in Varna and 2 each in Gorna Oryahovitsa, and one each in Lom, Panagyurishte, Ruse and Tarnovo.

In 1924, the first postal and philatelic book in Bulgaria was published – "History of the Post from the earliest times to the present day", author Kiro Petrov.

In 1926, the first issue of "Postal Stamp" magazine was published, originally as "Organ of Bulgarian Postage Stamp Collectors" with editor Dimitar Iv. Goshev, then as a body of the "First Bulgarian Philatelic Society in Sofia" and finally, in 1938, it became a body of the Union of Bulgarian Philatelic Societies with chief editor Stefan Simov.

On November 27th, 1925, a philatelic society was founded in Sofia with Boris Hadzhikalchov as its chairman. From June 1926, the society organized weekly stamp exchange meetings.

The first philatelic library was created in Sofia in 1927, when Borova Hadzhikalchov donated to the society about 200 volumes of Bulgarian and foreign philatelic literature.

In 1927, the first regulation on the exchange of postage stamps (No. 6/1927) was published in the magazine "Postal Stamp" and in 1928, the first youth section of the Sofia Philatelic Society was established.

The first philatelic exhibition in our country, organized in 1930, took place on the ground floor of the publishing house of Hristo G. Danov in Sofia. From 1937 to 1947, the magazine "Bulgarian Stamp" was published. Its editor and publisher is the philatelist and stamp dealer Simeon Charakchiev (1914–1993). The catalog for the Bulgarian postage stamps "Sima", published until 1958, is also his work.

On November 10, 1937, a new society named "Balkan Club" was founded in Sofia, and on November 25, 1937, a group of scientists and members of the public founded the Scientific Philatelic Club of Sofia, chaired by Prof. Rafail Popov, director of the National Archaeological Museum.

In 1937, philatelic societies were founded in Gorna Djumaya, Stara Zagora, Vidin, Pazardzhik, Kazanlak and Veliko Tarnovo. The same year, the prominent Sofia philatelist Dimitar Goshev published the catalog "DIGE".

On June 16 – 17, 1938, the Constituent Congress of the Union of Bulgarian Stamp Societies was held. Delegates from the three Sofia societies, as well as the societies in Veliko Tarnovo, Nova Zagora, Pazardzhik, Ruse, Stara Zagora, are participating in the congress.



At the same time, there were societies in Gabrovo, Varna, Kazanlak, Dupnitsa, but they did not send delegates.

The eight founding societies of the Union represented about 500 organized philatelists. Georgi Geshov was elected chairman.

In 1938, the companies in Pleven, Kyustendil and Topolovgrad were also founded.

Vaclav Stari, a member of the Sofia society, participated for the first time in the international exhibition "Bratislava 38", and won the 2nd Prize and a Silver Medal.

On July 16th, 1939, the First Regular Congress of the Union was held. Georgi Geshov was re-elected as chairman. In the same year, the newly formed companies in Byala, Botevgrad and Varna were accepted as members of the Union.

The FOUNDATION of the BULGARIAN PHILATELIC UNION

The Bulgarian Philatelic Union is founded on June 16th 1938 – the first birthday of His Royal Highness Prince Simeon. He was announced to be President in Honour of the Bulgarian Philatelic Union. This lasts till today.






The round special cancellation is in occasion of the Prince's birthday, the square one – in occasion of the founding congress of the Bulgarian Philatelic Union.

Spain took the First place, a tie in the Second place between Italy and U.S.A and a third place France and Chinese Taipei.



32nd EVENT of building KING MATJAŽ'S CASTLES 2024

and POST OFFICE 2023 ČRNA NA KOROŠKEM

King Matjaž (also Matiaš, Hungarian Mátyás, German Matthias, Czech Matyáš) is the central hero of the folk tales of Central Europe and the legend says that under the mountain Peca above Črna in Carinthia in the Mežiška valley "King Matjaž sleeps with his army", who will help everyone, who will be asked for help.

In memory of the mythical King every year on the last weekend in January, since 1992, a snow castle-building competition is held. The organizers prepare a sufficient supply of snow, and teams of builders build various sculptures according to pre-prepared plans throughout Saturday from sunrise onwards, which are then illuminated by countless torches and numerous campfires after sunset. Magical!

Watching these constructions is an event. How palaces, figures, and other sculptures are created from snow bricks. Over thirty years of the event, almost fifteen hundred "castles" were created!

On Sunday, there are various social events, especially the arrival of the mythical king Matjaž and the search for his treasure. (This year it was a chest of sweets, which were then distributed to all the children present).





For almost 75 years, the Carinthian Philatelic Society (Koroško filatelistično društvo, recipient of the FEPA award 2018) has been dutifully commemorating events in its immediate and wider environment with philatelic sets, cooperating with individuals as well as associations and municipalities. The philatelic commemoration of the construction of King Matjaž's castles is taking place this year for the twelfth time in a row.

In 2013, on the occasion of the 20th anniversary of the event, a new logo was created for the event – a stylized wall with cyns above and below with an entrance in the form of a five-leaf crown, which was also used for the first philatelic set, consisting of a commemorative postage stamp, a commemorative envelope, a personal postage stamp and a maximum of the card. At the same time, all other graphic products (flyers, posters, online notifications,...) summarized the basic design concept of philatelic products and thus became part of open philately. A personal postage stamp is also made every year.


CROATIA Vanja Radauš



On February 8th, 2024. **Romfilatelia** introduces into circulation a traditional philatelic issue, the **Chinese Zodiac. Year of the Wood Dragon**, composed of a postage stamp with the value of **Lei 25** and a First Day Cover. Unlike the European Zodiac, the Chinese Zodiac corresponds to a period of approximately one year. The signs begin with the Chinese New Year, on the second New Moon after the winter solstice, so it is not always celebrated on the same date. It is divided into 12 sections, but each of them belongs to an animal: tiger, rabbit, dragon, snake, horse, goat, monkey, rooster, dog, pig, rat, and ox. A cycle of the Chinese Zodiac lasts 60 years. During this time, all signs pass, in turn, through each of the following five elements: metal, water, wood, fire and earth.




The 2024 Chinese New Year begins on February 10th, 2024 and ends on January 28th, 2025. It is the Year of the Wood Dragon.

The Dragon, a mythological creature, is endowed with extraordinary powers and it is perceived in the Chinese tradition as a symbol of the imperial power and of the male principle, Yang, associated with stability and reliability. As a consequence, a year of noticeable progress is announced, in which the nurturing and supportive Earth element will stimulate growth and development.

_150th Anniversary pf the Croatian Medical Association





The Croatian Medical Association was established at a time when there were only 7 national medical associations in Europe, a fact that was highly regarded by other similar European and World Medical Associations

The creator of this Caricature, Srećko Puntarić (Felix) was born in 1952 in Zagreb. He was also a contributor to European humor magazines (Nebelspalter and Eulenspiegel).

Mărţișor - March Amulet

On March 1st, Romfilatelia introduced March Amulet (Mărţişor) Day postage stamps issue, consisting of 4 stamps, a First Day Cover and a special product in limited edition, unique philatelic March amulets.



As a symbol of spring, the March Amulet (Mărţişor) appears as a sign of the return to life of nature with its entire universe. It is offered every year on March 1st, as a talisman of appreciation, luck and prosperity. Men give it to ladies and young ladies as a sign of admiration and respect.

Mărţişor was included in the UNESCO Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity in 2017, as "cultural events associated with the celebration of March 1st", the proposal being made in a collective file by Bulgaria, North Macedonia, Moldavia and Romania.
